Welcome to Belmont Chapel!

We're delighted to have you with us and look forward to getting to know you better. This leaflet is designed to give you a brief overview of all that happens at Belmont Chapel on Sundays and during the week.



Who are we?

Belmont Chapel is a large congregation of Christians meeting in the centre of the city of Exeter.

Our aim is to share the good news of Jesus Christ with those who don't yet know him and to deepen the discipleship of those who already do.

We are an independent, evangelical church with strong Bible teaching, lively worship and the involvement by as many people as possible in running the church.



Sunday services

We have services on Sunday mornings at 9.30 am and 11.15 am. We also run a 10.00AM Alternative which offers a more interactive style of learning with small discussion groups. There is a crèche at both morning services and children's and young people's groups meet during the 9.30 service. Our evening service takes place at 6.30 pm. All services include worship, teaching and Communion (either morning or evening). Members of the Prayer Team are available to pray with you after each Communion Service. Tea and coffee are served in the Concourse after each service.

Are you new to Belmont Chapel?

We welcome you! Please do stay for refreshments after the service. And keep an eye open for people wearing **welcome badges**. These people will tell you all about what happens here on Sundays and during the week and give you leaflets about any area of church life that particularly interests you. We hope that very soon you'll feel very much part of Belmont Chapel.



Home groups

Home groups are small groups of around 12-15 people which meet together fortnightly in a home to study the Bible, pray together and support each other. As Christian disciples we all need supportive relationships with other believers so we can grow in our knowledge and love of God and be there for each other in the ups and downs of daily life. It can be difficult to really get to know people well in the Sunday crowds which is why belonging to a home group is so important—and that's why we encourage everyone who comes to Belmont regularly to join a group.



We have over 28 groups around the city (including a group for people with special needs). Groups meet fortnightly (on Mondays or Wednesdays) and are organised geographically. We meet regularly to study the Bible and pray for one another and the needs of the wider world. Bible studies are often based around the Sunday teaching programme and offer the opportunity to reflect on what was taught and discuss how we can apply it to our lives. Groups also organise social events.

Want to know more about Christianity? Then you're especially welcome at Belmont!

We're excited about our faith and want to **share the story** with you so you can **live the life**. Each term on Tuesday evenings we run discussion groups to help you find out how you can enjoy a personal relationship with God. These are relaxed, informal meetings where no questions are off limits. The 10AM Alternative on Sunday mornings is for people who want to find out about the Christian faith. There's a relaxed, friendly feel to the meetings where we explore of-the-moment issues in jargon-free and accessible ways with time to discuss what you hear. 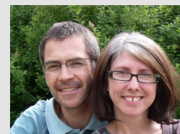

We encourage all young adults to join a home group and be fully involved in church life. **If you're a student** come to **The Café** on term-time Sundays at 8pm where we tackle relevant issues with plenty of time to chill, chat and be challenged. If you're a 1st year student, we can also arrange for you to be adopted by a family and meet up with another Christian to study the Bible and pray regularly.

If you're a young adult (and not a student) we have two great monthly opportunities for you to meet up: **Super Saturdays**, 10am at The Imperial for a great breakfast and talk/discussion on a relevant topic and **Social Sundays** after the 11.15am service which is a great chance to enjoy Sunday lunch together.
